ABOUT THE PROJECT

The National Student Design Project is intended to get middle and high school students thinking about the safety of their schools and communities.

HOW TO ENTER

High Schoolers: students can submit a poem, story, song, or rap that expresses their thoughts on school violence and safety. Any form of writing is accepted. Submissions can be fictitious or factual, and are meant to encourage kids to speak up against school violence. Please visit the NSSW website (www.safeschoolsweek.org) for materials and suggestions for getting the conversation started.

Middle Schoolers: students can design a T-shirt that includes the SPEAK UP hotline (**1-866-SPEAK-UP**) and website (www.speakup.com). The T-shirt can depict a symbol, pattern or simple image that is eye-catching), and contains a message promoting safety. A handout with a blank t-shirt template and some tips about designing T-shirts can be found on the NSSW website.
